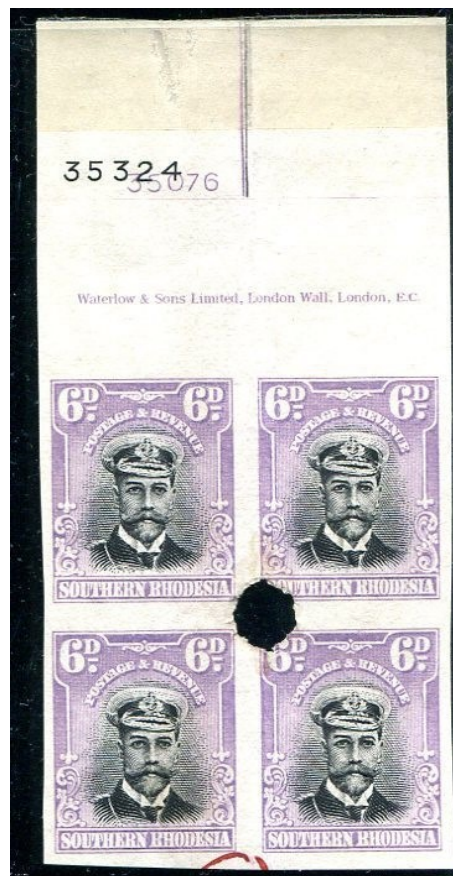

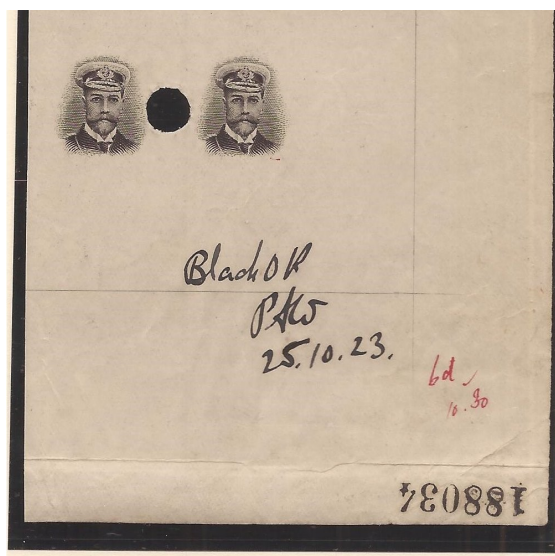

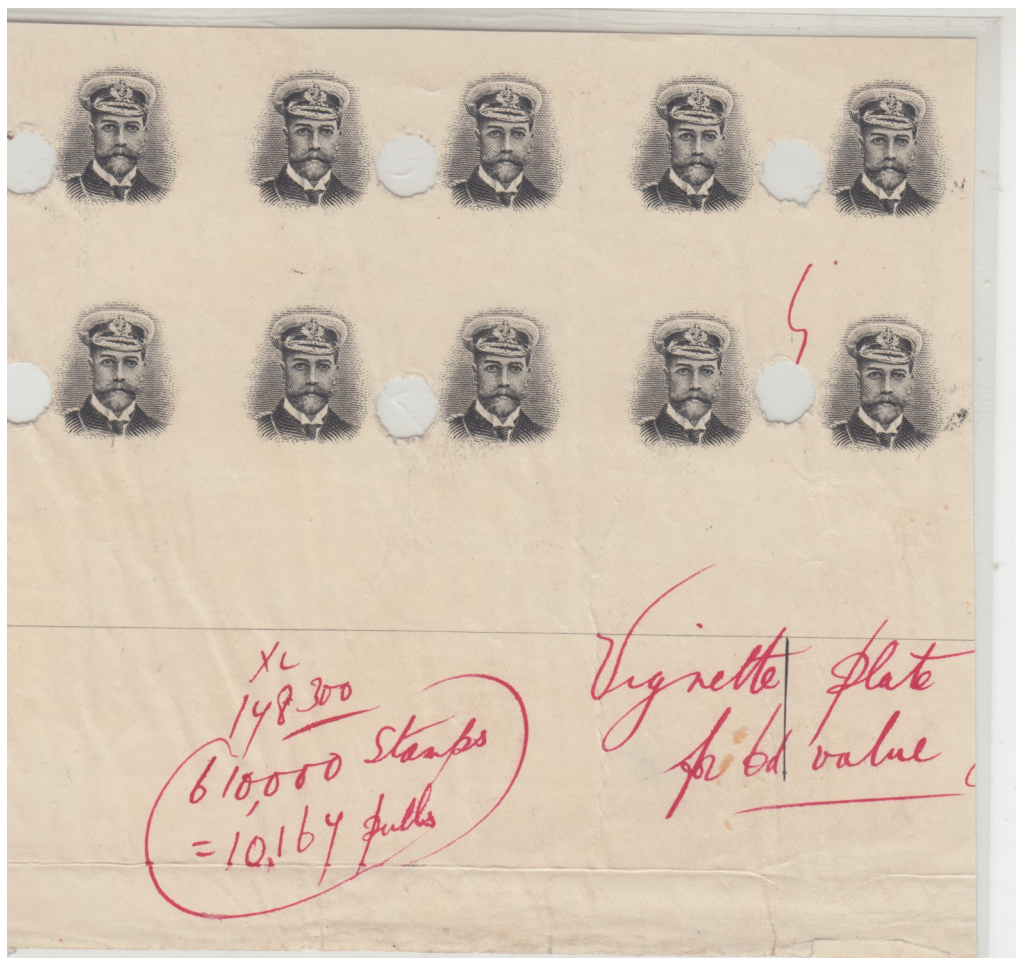

17th October 1923 Printing
Order No.178300 Print Qty. 610,000



There were 5 sheets for the 6d. The imperforate vignette proof was missing but there were 2 imperforate combined sheets the first marked "XL 178,300. Casement wording correct. Improve register LFH 6.11.23 12.55" "610,000 stamps = 10,167 pulls", the second marked "Border Color Correct 7.11.23" (both sheets numbered 188,046, the first also 375, the second 54). The perforated sheet was marked "Proceed NEF 13.11.23" and the file copy "178,300 17.10.23 610,000 stamps".

17th October 1923 Printing cont.



29th August 1924 Printing

Order No.234805 Print Qty. 600,000



Note sheet endorsed 60.000 stamps but
 $60 \times 10,000 = 600,000$



Again 5 sheets. Part only of the imperforate vignette remained (12 stamps from top 2 rows); the combined sheet was complete. The two record sheets were missing and only 33 stamps of the file copy remained, but the bottom margin was endorsed "See Standard for correct color"

VI The Archive sheet cover notes that no details survived for this printing. The only sheet in the Archives was the perforated file copy, and this was broken up for sale, leaving 33 stamps remaining when the folder was examined in 1987.

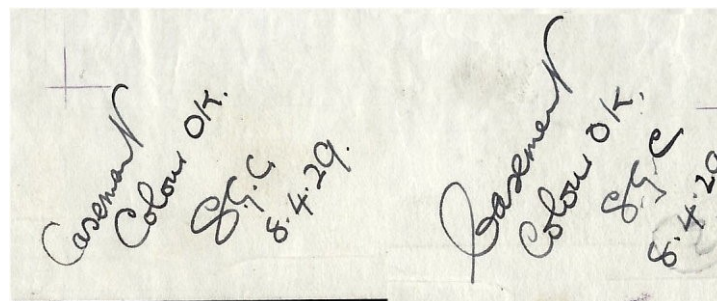


4 sheets. The imperforate vignette and the combined sheets were marked as usual, and a further imperforate sheet was marked "Must be returned to Mr. Soares(?)". 33 stamps of the file copy remained.

15th March 1929 Printing
Order No.230512 and 233228 Print Qty. 180,000



IX/X 5 sheets. The imperforate vignette had both order numbers, but the combined sheet only had XL 233,228 180,000 stamps = 3,000 pulls. There were 2 combined imperforate sheets, the second of which was marked "Duplicate. Casement colour OK SGC 8.4.29". The file copy was dated 15.3.29 endorsed "233,228 180,000 stamps", with 33 stamps remaining.
