

# MOZAMBIQUE COMPANY AND SOUTHERN RHODESIA COMBINATION COVERS

From March 1932 to early August 1932, airmail sent from Mozambique Company went by train from Beira to Salisbury, then by air with Imperial Airways flights

There was no agreement for carriage of this mail by Imperial Airways until 17 August 1932

Full international postage of 1\$40 was paid with a Mozambique Company stamp, and Southern Rhodesia stamps were added for full airmail postage (in this case 11d to Europe other than the UK)



The Beira CDS of 5 April 1932 is partly covered by the Southern Rhodesia stamps, showing that these stamps were not applied in Beira but rather in Salisbury, cancelled on 7 April 1932

The airmail instructional label is also a Southern Rhodesia label

This travelled via IA AN57 leaving Salisbury 8 April 1932, reaching Brindisi 15 April 1932 and thence by train to Switzerland
