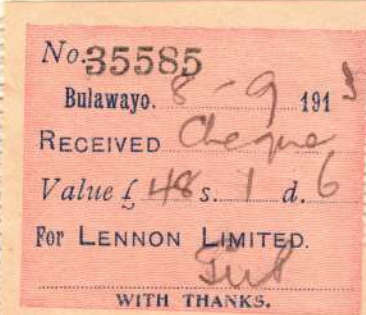


RHODESIA DOUBLE HEADS 1910-3

Pos 10A, Final State (9) according to Keith Watkins. The significant scratches starting on the North Margin above the East Value tablet and ending under IC of Africa are not mentioned by Watkins in his magnus opus and are not apparent on any other 10 A's I have, leading to the conclusion that this is in fact the real Final State. Hopefully Robert Gibbs will confirm.

Bob Gibbs has added Position 10A to the other 9 positions he has fully researched. His comment was: Working on 10A was no fun – nothing but obfuscation and frustration!

Watkins Final State 9 translates into Gibbs State 15. The significant scratches mentioned above are Gibbs State 17a and Gibbs State 17b may just be visible. Gibbs State 18 is visible. Gibbs last 3 States (19, 20 and 21) are clearly not part of this stamp
