All the small format stamps valid for revenue use

In all there are seventy-eight different postage and revenue stamps in this design including basic perforation and watermark varieties, not including errors. There are also twelve different postal stationery items.



All the medium format stamps valid for revenue use

The GV issues are inscribed 'Postage & Revenue' beneath the portrait, omitted on the GVI and QEII definitives. All the exclusively revenue values are inscribed 'Revenue'.

The three GV postal stationery cards are just inscribed 'Postage', and the other postal stationery items have nothing below the portrait.

Most of these stamps are fairly easily obtainable, but blocks, particularly positional blocks of the first issue are very scarce. In the display there is a set of sheet number blocks bar the 10d and 7/6 which are marginal blocks.

1925 Game Licence, (misspelt on the form) curiously using a combination of stamps rather than a single £50. Permission granted to kill an alarming number of animals, seems odd today.

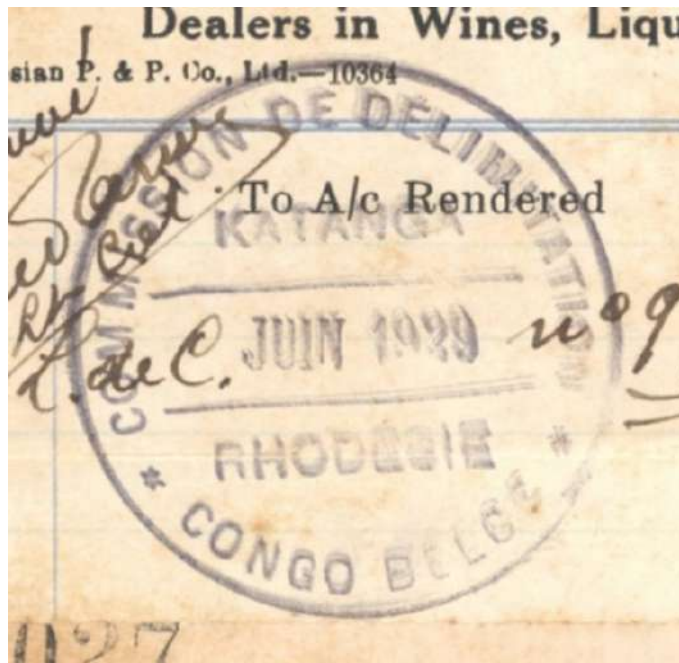

The 3/- value only exists from the unnumbered plate

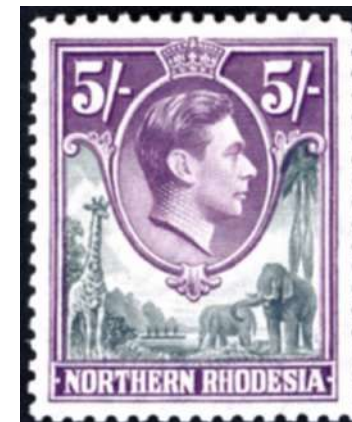

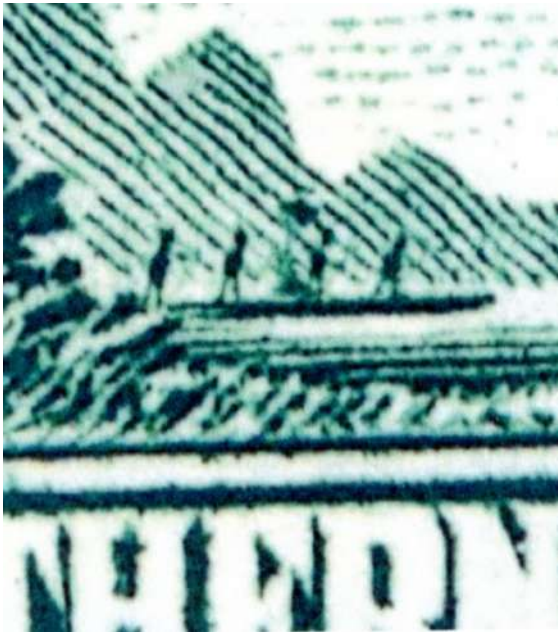

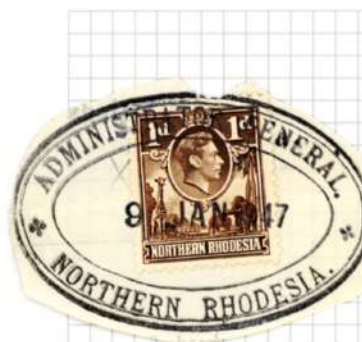
Tick bird flaw, row 7 stamp 1, found on both colours of the 1 1/2d. Also illustrated are stamps from the same position on the sheet without the flaw.



There are numerous flaws on this issue, probably most are batch flaws. Although not listed, the illustrated flaw in the base of the crown occurs on both the red and the purple 2d value plate 1, row 3 stamp 10, so can be considered a constant flaw.

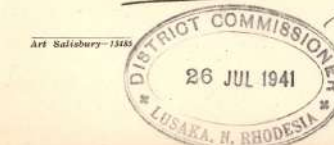

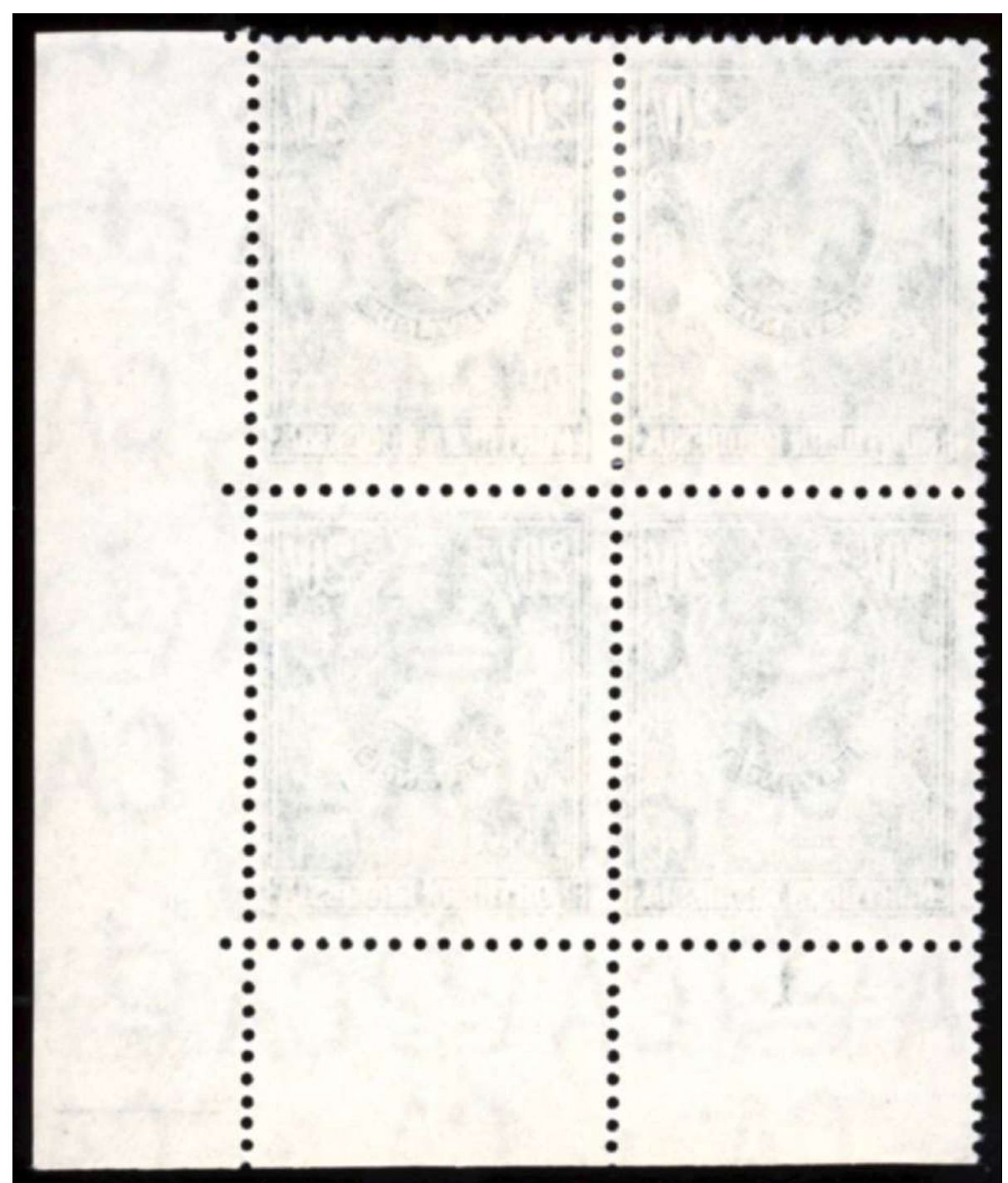

Some blocks of the QEII revenue issue. These were originally printed by Waterlow, but from 1961, the 1d, 6d, 1/-, 2/6, 10/- and 20/- were printed by De La Rue. The 1d and 20/- are known with the De La Rue imprint, so the others probably have the same. Sheets of some of these values ex the archive were broken up and sold, these included imprint and plate blocks.



The later printings of the 20/- were watermarked Block CA (as opposed to Script CA), but none of the other values appear to have been printed on this paper.



The very rare £30 used in combination with GV stamps in 1954. Why this stamp is so elusive is not clear as there were apparently sixty sheets of forty stamps printed, the same as the £50, which though rare is more often seen.



This piece with six examples of the £50, originally in the Polakow collection, is included as it shows them used in a combination which also uses the GV £30. This means there were still some available, begs the question why more were ordered.

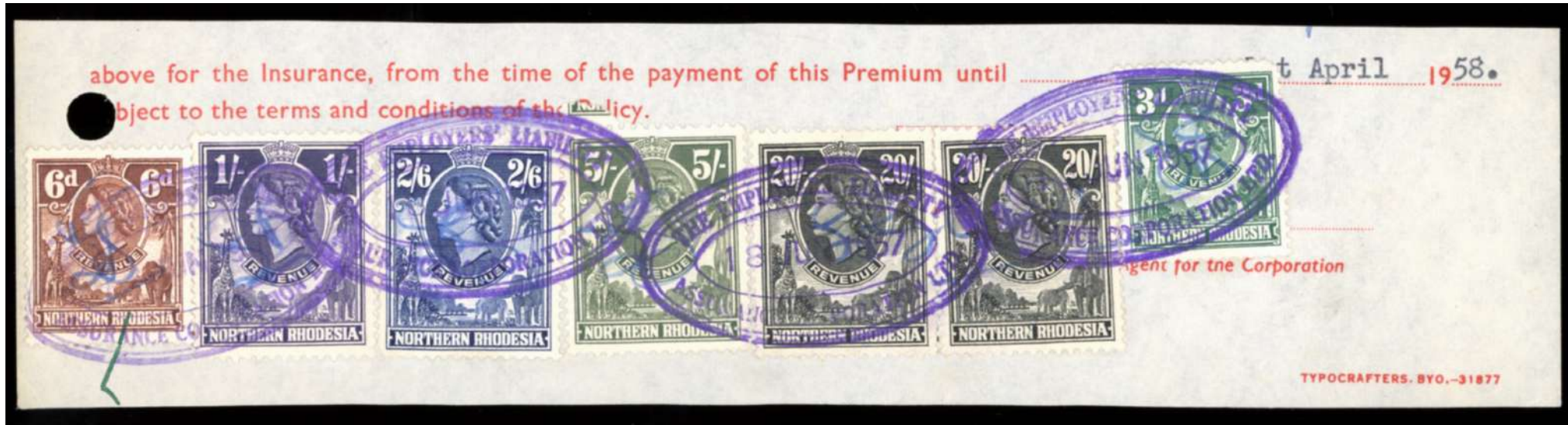

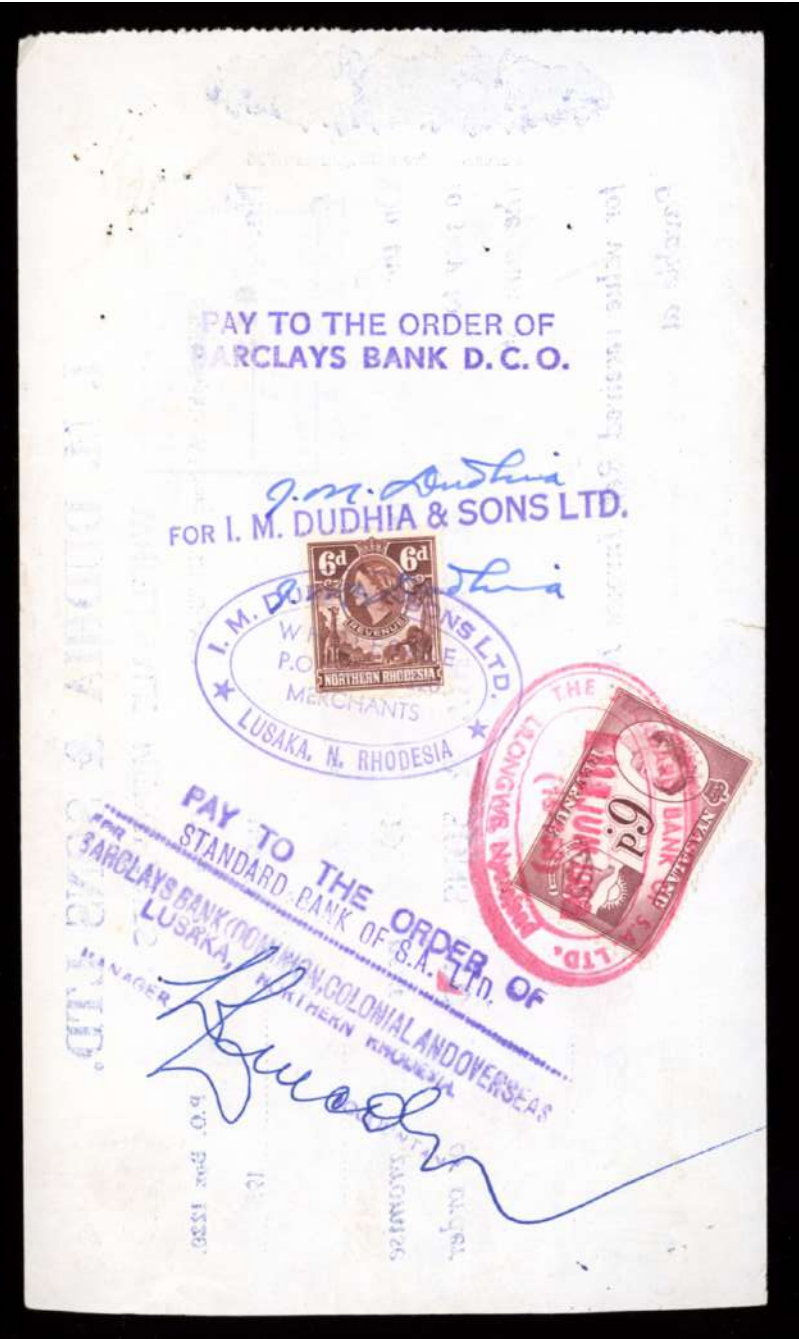

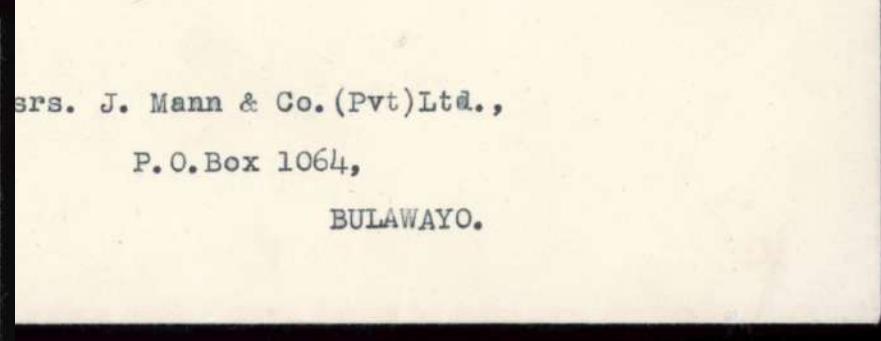
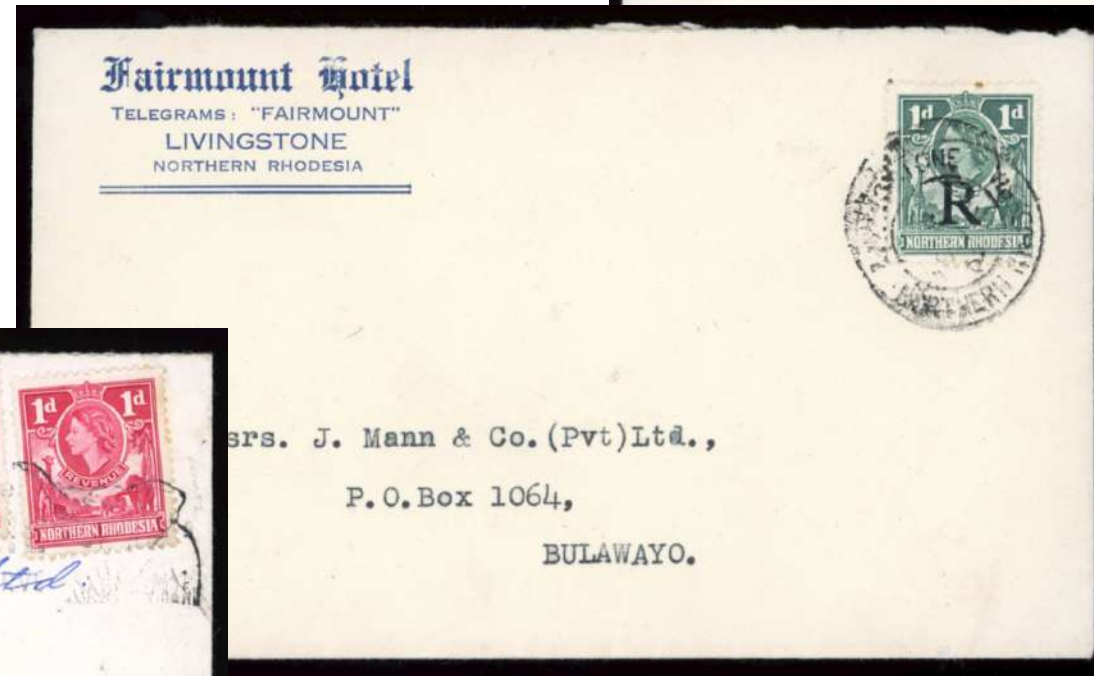
